Use this guide to inspire and build your faith as well as to stay in unity with those at Freedom Gate Church who are also fasting and praying. Begin each day in the Word and in prayer. The strength and endurance you need to complete this fast will surely come to you as you “seek first” His Kingdom every day. Remember, our God is a rewarder of those who diligently seek Him. Journal everything the Lord speaks to you during your fast. Please join us whenever you are able for our nights of worship and prayer. *If you have any known medical conditions or suspect such conditions, consult your doctor before beginning this or any fast.*

### Fasting - Getting Ready

1. Choose how you are going to fast for 21 days Simply put, fasting means giving up something natural to gain something spiritual. So, you decide what you want to “fast” from during the 21-day time period and how you will replace that with a spiritual commitment. In the Bible, Daniel chose to fast all foods except vegetables, fruits and water. He also put no entertainment before his eyes. This is the fast he chose. Many churches today prescribe a modified Daniel fast (fruits, vegetables, only whole grains, flatbreads, oils, nuts, etc). This is something you must choose that works for you. We have lots of recipes and guides to help you if you desire to do a Daniel-type fast. But don't forget other things like social networking, tv and movies, games, anything that you could “fast” in order to devote that time to prayer, the Word of God and waiting on Him.
2. Choose a set amount of time to pray each day; 30 minutes - one hour.
3. Choose set times each day to pray.
4. Set you personal prayer goals and pursue them in prayer every day. Share those with others if you want to pray in agreement.
5. Also, please pray over our corporate prayer goals, too.

## Prayer & Fasting Guide - 2016

### A New Year “With God”

The beginning of a new year is a wonderful time to enter a season of fasting and prayer. These special times are for seeking the Lord, consecrating our lives anew unto the Lord, and taking the next steps into our purpose and destiny in God.

It is also critical in re-establishing first things first! When Jesus called His disciples, He set their first priority as “being with Him” before any other thing, including ministry. So let us seize this season to re-order our priorities.

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*And He appointed the twelve, so that they would be with Him and that He could send them out to preach*  
*Mark 3:14*

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As you use this guide, I challenge you to read the scripture passages out loud. Pray your prayers out loud. Pray with fervency and sincerity of heart. Don't allow your time of fasting to be merely dietary changes. Take “quality” time every day to be alone with Him in prayer, worship and in the Word. Write down what He speaks to you. Write down your faith goals and revisit them often.

Let's consecrate this time. For truly “with God” nothing is impossible.

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## Day One - Monday January 11

**Read:** Matthew 6:16-13; Mark 6:33-52; Romans 4:13-22

Allow the truth of God's Word to challenge you. In every situation consider and do these things:

1. Take an honest assessment of where you stand in relation to the promises of God. Abraham contemplated his situation, and as dire as things were in the natural, he chose to respect the promises of God. He grew strong in faith and received what was promised!
2. Be determined to not fall short of the glory of God. Commit to begin to live life "with God." Seek God's glory in each and every situation. Ask, "What does the Word say about this?" And always remember, the things that are impossible with people, are possible with God!
3. Bless what you do have, and do not curse. Be careful to not curse or cling to your fishes and loaves! When Jesus "blessed" and "gave thanks" for what was offered, we see what was not enough become more than enough in the supernatural kingdom.
4. Seek first the Kingdom and His righteousness. Because Abraham believed God it was credited to him as righteousness. We must seek first His kingdom in everything, and understand His kingdom is sought after by faith. Ask the Holy Spirit to reveal what the promise fulfilled looks like - with the eyes of faith.

Humble yourself before the Lord in prayer today. Commit to living life in 2016 with God! Ask Him to forgive and cleanse you from any and all unrighteousness. This includes not merely sinful behaviors, but also includes unbelief,. Receive His love, forgiveness and restoration. Now let's REBOOT our faith!

## Day Two - Tuesday January 12

**Read:** John 17:1-3; John 7:37-39; Rev. 22:16-17; Psalm 36:7-9

Keep in mind, it was Jesus who said, “Now this is eternal life, that they may *know* You.” The word *know* in the original language is speaking of an intimate knowing. It’s the same “knowing” in which Adam knew his wife, Eve, and husbands and wives have known each other ever since.

Father God, who loves the human heart in a way we will never fully understand, is always seeking to draw us into a deeper, more intimate relationship with Himself.

Jesus unveiled His true feelings and intentions for us when He referred to Himself as a bridegroom. He said to the disciples of John the Baptist, *“How can the guests of the bridegroom mourn (fast) while he is with them? The time will come when the bridegroom will be taken from them; they they will fast.”*

Fasting, more than anything, is to be the genuine cry from our heart for deeper intimacy with Jesus! Jesus used bridal terminology to convey His deepest feelings for us! He understood that there is something about romantic, passionate language that touches the heart like nothing else can.

Don’t be afraid of this, but press into intimacy with the Lord. Ask Him to make Himself known to you in new ways. Ask Him to let you experience His great love, in a way that goes beyond mere knowledge. Draw near to the Lord during this fast and He WILL draw near to you! Drink of the fountain of His pleasures!

## Day Three - Wednesday January 13

**Read:** Isaiah 58:1-14

Meditate on the promises to those who honor a lifestyle of fasting and delighting in the Lord. He desires to:

- loosen the bonds of wickedness
- undo the bands of the yoke
- let the oppressed go free
- break every yoke!

Our light will break out like the dawn and our recovery will spring forth! His righteousness will go before us and His glory will be our rear guard! He will continually guide us and satisfy our desire! He will give strength to our bones and we will be like a watered garden!

In light of these promises, as you pray today take time to:

- contemplate where you are and where the Lord intends for you to be
- delight in the Lord and ask the Holy Spirit to reveal to you what the promises fulfilled look like in your life
- ask the Lord to help you to no longer “fall short” of His glorious intentions for you

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*God wants you to pray confident prayers based on who You know Him to be and what you know Him to have promised.*

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## Day Four - Thursday January 14

**Read:** 1 John 3:7-8; John 8:31-36; Romans 8:1-4

Jesus destroyed the works of the devil on the cross of Calvary. He has come to set us free! He sets us free by the truth of His Word and by our obedience to walk after the Holy Spirit and not our flesh. But be not deceived, all who practice sin are enslaved.

Examine your life and ask the Holy spirit to bring conviction where needed. He will bring conviction for the purpose of us becoming free. He never condemns us!

Acknowledge (confess) any and all sin in your life. Receive His love and forgiveness, but also receive His grace (power) to break the bands of wickedness and set your free through repentance.

Repentance is changing direction and changing the way you think. No longer speak over yourself that you are a sinner. Begin to speak Truth over yourself, "I am a new creature in Christ Jesus the old things have passed away and new things have come!"

Pray and commit your heart to abide in the Word as a true disciple.

It is the truth that you *know, understand* and *walk in* that sets you free!

No one can consistently walk in freedom, unless they consistently abide in the Word of God.

## Day Five - Friday January 15

**Read:** Isaiah 53:3-5; Matthew 8:16-17; 1 Peter 2:24-25; 3 John 2; Galatians 3:13-14

Jesus bore **our** sins, sicknesses, pains. He became a curse for us! By His stripes we were healed spirit, soul and body!

There is not an area of our lives (spiritually, emotionally, mentally or physically) that He hasn't made a way for us to be healed!

Contemplate your health (spirit, soul, body). Make an honest assessment and then choose to respect the promises of God!

Give thanks to Him for being your Healer. Thank Him for good health and strength.

Ask the Lord to heal you and begin to thank Him for it!

Ask the Holy Spirit to reveal to you, by faith, a picture of you healthy! Decree that 2016 is your year of healing and restoration, in Jesus' name!

Review the fasting promises in Isaiah 58 and claim them for your healing!

Remember, in the natural this is impossible but not with God. For all things are possible with God!

You are "with God" in 2016, therefore, you are healed!

## Day Six - Saturday January 16

**Read:** John 3:1-5; Hebrews 3:7-4:2; Ephesians 1:17-23

Today we can hear His voice, believe Him, and enter into His rest!

Unbelief keeps us from enjoying “the rest” of the Lord!

We enter His rest through the promises. We have had good news preached to us and we must respond righteously by faith!

Ask the Lord to soften your heart and enlighten your spiritual senses.

Ask Him to open the eyes of your heart and to give you a spirit of wisdom and of revelation in the knowledge (the knowing) of Him!

Ask Him to help you **see** the kingdom and to enter into His rest.

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*God wants you to know the hope of His calling, the riches of the glory of His inheritance in the saints, and the surpassing greatness of His power toward believers. To know these important truths, you must ask God to enlighten the eyes of your heart.*

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## Day Seven - Sunday January 17

**Read:** 2 Corinthians 4:13; Psalm 19:14; Psalm 27:13-14;  
Psalm 49:3; Psalm 104:34

Take time today to reflect and meditate on all the things the Lord has been speaking to you this week.

Review your prayer guide and the Scriptures. As you do this, begin to write “faith decrees” and begin to speak them out loud - daily and often.

Hold fast the confession of your faith - for He is the High Priest of your confession!

Speak the words of Psalm 103 out loud over your life. Remind your very soul of the benefits of a life “with God!”

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*Bless the Lord, O my soul, and all that is within me, bless His holy name. Bless the Lord, O my soul, and forget none of His benefits; Who pardons all your iniquities, Who heals all your diseases; Who redeems your life from the pit, Who crowns you with lovingkindness and compassion; Who satisfies your years with good things, So that your youth is renewed like the eagle.*

*Psalm 103:1-5*

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## Day Eight - Monday January 18

**Read:** Ephesians 3:14-21; John 14:16-23; Colossians 1:19-27

This weeks focus is God “with us,” God actually “in us!” The riches of the glory of the mystery is now made known - Christ **in us** the hope of glory! Jesus promises that He will come and make our hearts His home (abode). Jesus resides in us, in our hearts! So we should expect to experience Jesus **within** us, as well as “with us” or alongside of us. This reality (Christ in us) can only be realized and experienced through faith (Ephesians 3:17).

Mediate on the above passages, and ask the Holy Spirit to strengthen you with power, in your inner man (your heart), so that Jesus may dwell in your heart (through faith). Activate your faith to believe this reality in your heart and to really know (experience) His love, which surpasses knowledge. Ask Him to fill you with the fullness of Himself! Pray the Apostle Paul’s prayer over your own heart and life (Ephesians 3:14-21). Pray it out loud, from the heart, in the first person. Invite Him to not just come and visit you, but to come and **stay** with you.

Invite Him to make your heart His home! Sincerely invite Him and He will come. This **is** our hope of glory! Hear His voice, and open the door. He’ll come in. He’s already been knocking!

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*“Behold, I stand at the door and knock; if anyone hears My voice and opens the door, I will come in to him and will dine with him, and he with Me.”*

*Revelation 3:20*

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## Day Nine - Tuesday January 1

**Read:** Philippians 2:5-8; 2 Cor. 8:9; Hebrews 2:14-18; John 1:14

God is “with us” to manifest His glory by doing those things which are impossible with man. But He also lives “in us” in our day to day ordinary lives!

Think about the years the disciples spent with Jesus - walking place to place, reclining at a table, dining together. The miracles and public ministry only account for a small portion of those three years. There was a lot of *ordinary living* doing life on earth!

We need the Church and fellowship with believers, but most importantly we need an intimate, personal and *ongoing* relationship with Jesus! There are 168 hours in your week. On average most believers spend about 2-4 hours weekly “in church.” Those hours together are important, but so are the other 164 hours! Jesus intends to live “in us” the whole week! The religious spirit resists the notion that God does anything outside a worship service or prayer meeting. We must resist this religious spirit!

Ask the Spirit to help you understand and experience the reality of Jesus being “in you” at all times. Pray for an understanding and awareness to the truth that Jesus is glorious and He also understands the ordinary parts of our lives. Our lives are not divided to secular and sacred. He wants to live “in us” and “through us” everywhere we go. Ask the Holy Spirit to help you remain in fellowship (communion) with Him when you leave your prayer closet, a Bible study or a worship setting.

“Teach them to observe all that I commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the age.” Matthew 28:20

## Day Ten - Wednesday January 20

**Read:** John 10:22-30; Hebrews 3:7-19; Luke 24:13-32

Often the Lord speaks and reveals Himself to us in ways we might not expect and we miss it because of hardness of heart and dullness of spiritual senses. Like the disciples on the road to Emmaus, we fail to recognize Him as we're going on our way. But he wants us to *recognize* Him in our everyday life!

Disciples of "religion" don't experience Jesus fully because they don't believe in the supernatural. But our Lord and His Kingdom are super-natural! In other words His Spirit "comes upon" our natural! He can and will speak to us through nature, a song, an the encouragement, through a dream, a sign, etc. And maybe we don't always catch, but later realize it was the Lord.

Someone could speak a timely word to us in a very ordinary way; a word that is perfect for the moment, and we fail to recognize it as being from God. Prophetic words like these will come forth in church services, but they also come to us anywhere, anytime or anyplace if we are looking and listening for them. Remember, He is "with us" and "in us" always!

Ask the Holy Spirit to help you hear His voice. Ask Him to reveal any area of your life where the deceitfulness of sin may have hardened your heart, and repent. Ask for your spiritual senses to be made aware of Him in everything, so that you may hear His still small voice in your inner man. Practice living life with your spiritual senses fully engaged; your ears inclined toward Him and your eyes open. Expect Him to reveal things and speak to you in every day life as well as when in prayer and Bible study.

## Day Eleven - Thursday January 21

**Read:** Matthew 12:36; Hebrews 2:9-18; Hebrews 3:1; Hebrews 4:14-16

Jesus tasted death for everyone in order to bring many sons to glory! He understands our human existence and experience because He lived it! He was tempted in all things, as a man, and yet He did not sin! He was fully God and fully man. And He sympathizes with our weaknesses.

He has paid the price for everyone who believes, and we can draw near to the throne of grace with all confidence. He is our “faithful” and “merciful” High Priest! He is consistently here for us. When we draw near to Him, we know that He’ll be merciful and give us grace to help.

It is important for us to remember that He is the High Priest of our confession. Therefore we must “hold fast” our confession. We must “say the same as” Him!

Ask the Spirit to help you examine your words. Our words are either bringing justification or condemnation into our lives.

Ask for and receive His mercy (forgiveness) for saying careless things, for cursing (instead of blessing), and for speaking words that don’t align with His words. Ask for the Grace to gain righteous control of your tongue.

Ask the Holy Spirit to help you to always know that when temptation comes, He is able willing to come to our aid for He is “in us” always!

## Day Twelve - Friday January 22

**Read:** Jeremiah 31:31-34; Hebrews 8:6-11; 2 Cor. 5:16-21

Jesus told Nicodemus (John 3) that in order to see the kingdom we must be “born again.” He didn’t say we need to “try again,” but we be “born again.” Made New! In Christ, all things are new and the old is passing away! We are a new creation, and we have a new identity as His righteous ones in Christ Jesus!

The Old Testament view of our hearts is that they are deceitful and wicked. But the New Covenant teaches that He has given us a new heart! He has purified our hearts! We can passionately live from the heart for Jesus! And if we will delight in Him, He will give us the very desires of our heart. (Psalm 37:4)

Receive this Good News today! Ask the Lord to cleanse you of any unrighteousness. Begin to give thanks for His saving Grace and the newness of life! Thank Him for not only saving you, but changing you and transforming you into a new creature! Begin to decree over your heart what the Word says about you; who are IN Christ!

Pray this prayer of repentance from Psalm 51:10-15: *Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a steadfast spirit within me. Do not cast me away from Your presence and do not take Your Holy Spirit from me. Restore to me the joy of Your salvation and sustain me with a willing spirit. Then I will teach transgressors Your ways and sinners will be converted to You. Deliver me from blood guiltiness, O God, the God of my salvation; Then my tongue will joyfully sing of Your righteousness. O Lord, open my lips that my mouth may declare Your praise.*

## Day Thirteen - Saturday January 23

**Read:** Matthew 15:1-9; Romans 10:8-11; Jeremiah 11:29-14

When we fail to live from our heart we live without the awareness of Jesus in our life, because Jesus lives in our heart. So believing the Lord, drawing near to Him and seeking Him must be from the heart!

Drawing near is when we fully open our heart to Him we become vulnerable to Him we allow Jesus to be intimate in every place of our heart. Loving God fully *begins* with loving Him with ALL our heart!

“Teach, which is the great commandment in the law?” and He said to him, “You shall love the Lord your God with ALL YOUR HEART, and with all your soul, and with all your mind.” Matthew 22:36-37

Draw near to Him today. Open your heart and invite Jesus to come into every place. Pray with sincerity and ask the Lord to help you find Him. Search for Him today, for He promises that He will allow us to find Him!

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*‘You will seek Me and find Me when you search for Me with all your heart. I will be found by you’ declares the Lord... Jeremiah 29:13-14*

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## Day Fourteen - Sunday January 24

**Read: Psalm 27:1-8; 2 Corinthians 3:12-18; John 14:1-23**

Jesus is no longer in the world (in the flesh) therefore the world can no longer see Him. But believers **will** see Him! By the presence and power of the Holy Spirit “in us,” He promises He will disclose (reveal) Himself to us! That we may **know** Him, not just know about Him.

The early church disciples spoke of having “revelations” of Jesus! They didn’t merely write and read books about Him, they experienced Him!

Let’s not doubt Him! He has promised to disclose Himself to us!

Don’t limit how He chooses to reveal Himself to you. Would you like to see His eyes, His smile, His glory? Then ask Him! Let Him be who He is with you. Take off the limits that your experience, religion, or theology has put on Him.

If we’ll **come to** Him, He will **come to** us!

His Spirit is saying to us in this hour, “Seek My face.” We must posture ourselves in prayer and fasting, to respond to Him “your face, O Lord, we shall seek!”

Take time in prayer, especially throughout this fast, to ask the Lord and wait upon Him. If you do He will disclose Himself to you. Like Moses, pray “O Lord, show me Your glory!”

*Day Fourteen continued -*

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*One thing I have asked from the Lord, that I shall seek;  
that I may dwell in the house of the Lord all the days of my  
life, to behold the beauty (delightfulness of the Lord and to  
meditate in His temple.*

*Psalm 27:4*

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Set your heart on making the ONE THING the main thing in your life. This is a choice, we all must be willing to make in the busy life and it must be our highest priority!

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*I would have despaired unless I had believed that I would  
see the goodness of the Lord, in the land of the living.  
Wait for the Lord; Be strong and let your heart take  
courage; Yes, wait for the Lord.*

*Psalms 27:13-14*

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Christ **in you** the hope of glory!

## Day Fifteen - Monday January 25

**Read:** Psalm 103:1-5; 2 Corinthians 1:18-22;  
2 Corinthians 5:17 - 6:2; Hebrews 6:11-12

Father God intends to reconcile every area of our life (spirit, soul, body) unto Himself through the sacrifice of His Son, Jesus!

He desires for us to prosper and be in good health, as our souls prosper (3 John 2).

His great salvation is more than forgiveness (though it certainly is forgiveness). It is also healing, freedom, and restoration of all things. He makes all things new. Praise His name! This is your inheritance!

We have a better covenant, enacted upon better promises. The covenant promises of God are our Promised Land, our inheritance!

As you examine your heart and life today, examine them in light of God's promises to you.

Stir yourself in prayer today to make sure you've not fallen short of His intentions for you in Christ Jesus.

Speak to your soul today! Tell your soul to not forget even one of His promises which are yes in Jesus! Don't allow yourself to be sluggish (disinterested) but set your heart to imitate those who through faith and patience **inherit** the promises.

## Day Sixteen - Tuesday January 26

**Read:** Jeremiah 29:10-14; Habakkuk 2:1-4

The Lord's intention is always to restore us and fulfill His good Word to us!

There are times we need to position ourselves before Him, in fasting and prayer, to see what He will speak to us. And to see how we will reprove us so that we will be able to walk by faith!

Ask Him to speak to you today.

Ask the Holy Spirit to reveal to you any course adjustments that are necessary and need to be made in your life. Especially pursue this with regard to this year of 2016. Don't fear His reproof! Your heavenly Father knows best.

Wait for Him to speak to you.

Ask Him to refresh your vision and make it plain to you

Write down what the Lord reveals.

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*Don't let what you didn't get in your childhood keep you from what God provides for His children - a perfectly faithful Father.*

**Read:** Numbers 13:15 - 14:24; Joshua 1:1-11

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## Day Eighteen - Thursday January 28

**Read:** Joshua 1:10-11; 2 Kings 3:14-18

Joshua told the children of Israel to prepare themselves for “crossing over” into their inheritance. When you believe the Word of the Lord, you will begin to prepare yourself accordingly.

Preparation is really the first step to activate our faith! In preparation we do what we are required to do, so as to make a way for the Lord to do what only He can do!

The preparations you make are demonstrating what you are really believing God for this year.

In prayer today, consider again the things (vision and goals) that you’re extending your faith for.

Ask the Lord to guide you in preparations that are necessary for you to see His glory.

Write it down and begin to ready yourself.

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*Then the Lord answered me and said, “Record the vision and inscribe it on tablets that the one who reads it may run. For the vision is yet for the appointed time; it hastens toward the goal it will not fail. Though it tarries wait for it; For it will certainly come, it will not delay.*

*Habakkuk 2:2-3*

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## Day Nineteen - Friday January 29

**Read:** John 17:1-17; John 8:31-32; Romans 12:1-2; 2 Corinthians 3:18; Joshua 1:7-9

It is very important for us to be renewed in our thinking. Changing the way we think is at the root meaning of repentance. This is true because as a man thinks in his heart so **is** he!

It is through a change in our thinking that we can experience the transformation we so desire and need. We are sanctified in Truth. His Word is Truth.

Allow the power of the Holy Spirit and the Word to bring a reformation to your thinking.

Ask the Spirit to renew you in the spirit of your mind, giving you the mind of Christ.

Ask the Lord to show you His glory and transform you in to HIS image.

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*Now to Him who is able to keep you from stumbling, and to make you stand in the presence of His glory blameless with great joy.*

*Jude 24*

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## Day Twenty - Saturday January 30

**Read:** Joshua 3:5; 2 Corinthians 6:22 - 7:1;  
2 Thessalonians 5:16-24

Consecration is about being set apart unto and for the Lord - for His purposes. It is about being committed to His plans and purposes for your life.

The process of consecration is sanctification. Sanctification begins when we allow Him to sanctify us **entirely** (spirit, soul, and body) to His glory! The beauty of this is if we will answer His call and sincerely **commit** our whole being, He is faithful to bring it to pass!

Ask the Holy Spirit for the grace and the guidance to consecrate your life to Him.

Determine that in every area where there is a need for reconciliation, you will always remember that there is **no** reconciliation without the Cross! We are reconciled through the sacrifice of Jesus by His blood!

Take communion today and place your life on the altar as a living sacrifice to Him.

Pray with boldness.

We're taking new ground in 2016 and there is no turning back!

## Day Twenty-One - Sunday January 31

**Read:** Joshua 3:1-17

Faith without action is dead! It is time to start moving and walking **by faith!**

It is important that we always step out by faith (believing His promises), with His presence and anointing (the ark), and in His timing (requiring us to be led by the Spirit).

Ask the Lord to fill you with a spirit of faith!

Ask Him to give you endurance to run the race - to finish and never quit. When you feel as though you are too weary and want to give up, set your eyes on Jesus and His Word! Reboot your faith!
